Key activities

The NSW Resources Regulator's key activities during the quarter included:

- 5 penalty notices totalling \$17,500 were issued in response to non-compliance with the Mining Act 1992
- one Mining Act enforceable undertaking was accepted, totalling \$87,500
- publication of 2 videos on the Regulator's YouTube channel highlighting an incident where a worker fell into a conveyor chute and a Lightning Ridge environmental awareness course
- 2 investigation information releases on an underground opal mine fatality and frictional ignition of methane
- safety bulletins concerning rockfall injuries, contraband in underground mines, hose ball valve injury and ignition risks from rare earth magnets
- fact sheets regarding rehabilitation reforms implementation for small mines and stage 1 of coal burst and rock burst
- media releases about illegal fossicking in Grawin Dumps and a ministerial visit to Mt Arthur coal mine
- publication of technical reference guides on raiseboring operations, stockpiles and reclaim tunnels, withdrawal and emergency escape from underground coal mines, and gas outbursts principal hazard management plan
- 16 presentations covering topics including emerging technologies, plant guarding, management safety kit, maintenance of competencies, legislation updates and incident reporting
- mine rehabilitation information alert.
















Proactive and reactive Mining Act site assessments conducted


There was a marked increase in the number of non-compliances resulting in an enforceable undertaking this quarter, and these have been shown in a separate chart.









Rehabilitation security deposit review

Our inspectors regularly assess the surface disturbance (or proposed disturbance) of a mine or exploration site to calculate the security deposit. This is known as the assessed deposit. Once the assessed deposit is determined, we advise the area within Mining, Exploration and Geoscience responsible for title administration who vary the condition of the title and seek the additional funds-or in the case of satisfactory rehabilitation, returns some or all of the security deposit.
