- It was evident that the candidates had done a lot of study prior to resitting the examination. This was clear in the legislation question. It is important that candidates have a sound knowledge and understanding of the legislation.
- The candidates also demonstrated good knowledge of workplace inspection standards, emergency management and identifying and addressing hazards using the hierarchy of controls.
- The candidates were able to satisfactorily demonstrate skills such as decision making, leadership, teamwork and communication skill during the emergency scenario.
