Examination fee schedule - certificates of competence

You must make payment of the application fee for each attempt to undertake an examination through the link below to a third-party payment website. The payment date and receipt number details are to be submitted with your complete application in the Resources Regulator portal prior to the closing date (refer [calendar](#)).

The application fee is non-refundable if your application is incomplete, unsuccessful or if you withdraw.

The amount for fees to sit the written examination based on number of papers to be attempted and the oral examination are provided below. The link to make payment of the applicable fee is provided to candidates in the approval to sit invitation email.

The fee is non-refundable if you do not attend the nominated examination without notifying us prior in the Resources Regulator portal.
