# **Key Activities**

The NSW Resources Regulator's key activities during the month included:

- issuing safety bulletins on hand injuries and the impact of severe weather on stope stability
- issuing a \$2,500 penalty notice to Whitehaven Coal Mining Limited for contravention of a condition of authorisation (s378D of the *Mining Act 1992*)
- publishing Mine rehabilitation portal guideline and revised rehabilitation cost estimation tool
- publishing consolidated reports for <u>fire and explosion (electrical)</u> and <u>spontaneous combustion</u> at underground coal mines, and <u>ground or strata failure</u> at underground metalliferous mines
- publishing compliance priorities <u>outcomes</u> for positive communication at metalliferous mines and Tier 1 quarries
- holding small mines roadshows at Dareton, Dubbo and Orange.

Other publications included:

- quarterly safety report for October to December 2021
- fires on mobile plant report for July to September 2021
- four weekly incident summaries detailing 15 dangerous incidents





### SAFETY ASSESSMENTS CONDUCTED BY SECTOR\*





Proactive assessments include targeted assessments and planned inspections. Reactive assessments are conducted in response to incident notifications, targeted interventions and high-risk activity notifications.


#### SAFETY SITE ASSESSMENTS CONDUCTED BY CATEGORY AND NATURE\*







Safety mining authorisations include licence applications to carry out prescribed high-level activities, plant item registrations, design registrations and exemptions.






## **Proactive and reactive assessments**







## Rehabilitation security deposit review

Our inspectors regularly assess the surface disturbance (or proposed disturbance) of a mine or exploration site to calculate the security deposit. This is known as the assessed deposit. Once the assessed deposit is determined, we advise the area within Mining, Exploration and Geoscience responsible for title administration who vary the condition of the title and seek the additional funds - or in the case of satisfactory rehabilitation, returns some or all of the security deposit.




## Non-compliance breaches sustained by category

SAFETY NON-COMPLIANCE BREACHES SUSTAINED BY REGULATORY RESPONSE






