### Executive summary

#### Overview

This report provides a summary of the performance for the provision of title assessments and processing within the NSW Department of Planning and Environment's Division of Resources and Geoscience (the Division) for:

- Quarter 4 2018 (1 October 2018 to 31 December 2018).
- Quarter 1 2019 (1 January 2019 to 31 March 2019).

The Division's performance is reported against the Service Delivery Standards, which note target timeframes for the processing of applications under the Mining Act 1992. These are published by the Division at:

### New workflow tracking system

The Quarter 1 2019 (Q1 2019) performance report is the first report using data extracted solely from a recently implemented workflow tracking system. This system provides better visibility and analytics over the processing of applications. The new system continues to undergo ongoing business improvement, with additional functionality to be added iteratively throughout 2019.

The data presented in Quarter 4 2018 (Q4 2018) performance report was extracted from the Titles Adminstration System (TAS), the predecessor to the new workflow management system. The reports for both Q4 2018 and Q1 2019 have been consolidated to ensure the integrity of all data and maximise data correlation across reporting periods during the transition to the new workflow tracking system.

#### Revised format

The format of the Q4 2018 and Q1 2019 performance reports has been revised to resemble a dashboard style with only key information presented. The intention is for this dashboard style to be carried forward for all future quarterly reports.

The format of the Q1 2019 performance report includes additional data for all decisions finalised in Q1 2019 by representing:

- Applications that were submitted prior to Q1 2019 and finalised in Q1 2019.
- Applications that were submitted in and finalised in Q1 2019.

### **Quarter 4 2018**

#### Performance overview

This following figure includes proposed decisions notified, security deposit releases and subsidence management plan approvals, as measured against the Service Delivery Standards published by the Division. The data presented in this report has been collected from 1 October 2018 to 31 December 2018. During this quarter, **60** notifications of proposed decisions, security deposit releases and subsidence management plan approvals were issued. Of these, **63 per cent** met the target timeframe.




Figure 2 Q1 2019 Service Delivery Standard Performance

# **Quarter 1 2019**

#### Application breakdown by timeframe (pre and post 2019)

It should be noted that not all proposed decisions/security releases/approvals finalised in Q1 2019 were submitted in that quarter. Of the total 146 proposed decisions/security releases/approvals finalised in Q1 2019, only 36 were submitted in the quarter. The remaining 110 were submitted prior to 2019, with some as far back as May 2015.




Figure 3 Breakdown of applications/determinations received pre and post 2019

#### Performance by timeframe (pre and post 2019)

The pie charts below categorise the Division's service performance by timeframe (i.e. on whether the application was received in Q1 2019 or prior to it). Of the 146 proposed decisions/security releases/approvals finalised in Q1 2019, 36 of them were received in Q1 2019, with a 100 per cent meeting the target timeframe. The remaining 110 applications finalised in Q1 2019 were received prior to Q1 2019, with 60 per cent meeting the target timeframe. This indicates a performance improvement in 2019.





Figure 5 Q1 Performance from applications received post 2019

### **Applications received**
