The worker was of their position relative to the winded and suffered bruising, scrapes and risk of unsupported ground mine soreness. The worker was cleared of injury after failure, which may occur without Ground or strata being assessed at hospital. warning. Operators should failure review the appropriateness of the equipment they have provided to workers to install the required ground support in a timely manner at all stages of the production cycle. If the appropriate equipment for the prevailing conditions is unavailable, work should not continue.

Dangerous Incident IncNot0044903 Underground coal mine

Airborne dust and other contaminants



A worker was using a mine dozer while cutting in a sump underground. During the shift, the dozer was used for 5 hours cutting the hard stone floor. During task planning, the risk of exposure to airborne contaminants must be considered.

When it is identified that stone is going to be cut such as sumps and overdrives, the hierarchy of controls should be followed. Controls such as worker segregation, ventilation, sprays, scrubbers and curtains should be implemented before personal protective equipment is considered.

Note: While the majority of incidents are reported and recorded within a week of the event, some are notified outside this time period. The incidents in this report therefore have not necessarily occurred in a one-week period. All newly recorded incidents, whatever the incident date, are reviewed by the Chief Inspector and senior staff each week. For more comprehensive statistical data refer to our annual performance measures reports.

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
