

Dangerous incident IncNot0045597 Underground coal mine The corrugated iron roof on a surface conveyor was damaged by stone. It was secured with rope. During high winds, the rope failed, ripping a sheet of iron from the structure. The sheet fell to the ground. Nobody was in the area at the time.



When plant is damaged, it must be made safe and left in a state suitable to continue operating. Any interim repairs must be conducted to a standard that poses no further risk.

Dangerous incident IncNot0045591 Surface coal mine A drilling operator was hit on the head and leg by a falling auger. The auger came loose and fell while installing the auger segment. The worker was wearing a hard hat and was given first aid treatment for a graze on their head.



Designers and operators of drilling plant such as augers and exploration drill rigs should review the method used to secure drill rods/augers. Engineering controls should be incorporated to ensure drill rods/augers are not released before being engaged and to protect workers from any falling drill rods/augers.

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Incident type	Summary	Comments to industry
Dangerous incident IncNot0045563 Underground metals mine	A worker was driving an articulated dump truck when they reached for a drink bottle. The truck hit a windrow, rode over the windrow and the tub rolled.	When operating mobile plant, workers must remain focused on controlling the item of plant and their surroundings. Mobile plant should be safely stopped before carrying out tasks that remove the focus from safely operating plant.
